


## CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES

In the House of Representatives, Monday, 24th August, 1789,

R ESOLVED, BY THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTA-TIVES OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, two thirds of both House deeming it necessary. The following Articles be proposed to the Legislaures of the feveral States, as Amendments to the Confliction of the United States, all or any of which Articles, when ratified by three fourths of the faid Legislaures, to be valid to all intents and purpoles as part of the faid Confliction—Viz.

ARTICLES inaddition to, and amendment of, the Confliction of the United States of America, propoled by Congrels, and ratified by the Legiflatures of the feveral States, purfuant to the fifth Arricle of the original Confliction.

#### ARTICLE THE FIRST.

After the firft enumeration, required by the firft Article of the Confliction, there fhall be one Reprefentative for every thirty thoufand, until the number fhall amount to one hundred, after which the propertion fhall be for regulated by Congrefs, that there fhall be not lefs than one hundred Reprefentatives, nor lefs than one Reprefentatives for every forty thouland perfors, until the number of Reprefentatives fiall amount to two hundred, after which the proportion fhall be for regulated by Congrefs, that there fhall no be lefs than two hundred Reprefentatives, nor lefs than one Reprefentative for every fifty thouland perfors.

#### ARTICLE THE SECOND.

No law varying the compensation to the members of Congress, fhall take effect, until an election of Representatives shall have intervened.

## ARTICLE THE THIRD.

Congrefs fhall make no law eftablifhing religion or prohibiting the free exercise thereof, nor fhall the rights of Conference be infringed.

## ARTICLE THE FOURTH.

The Freedom of Speech, and of the Prefs, and the right of the People peaceably to affemble, and confult for their common good, and to apply to the Government for a redrefs of grievances, fhall not be infiringed.
