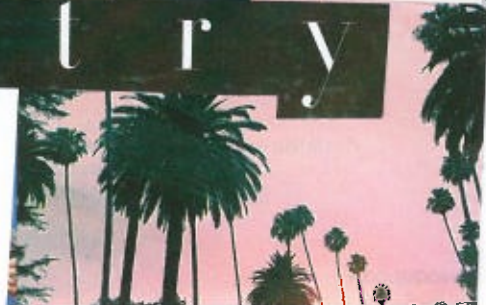

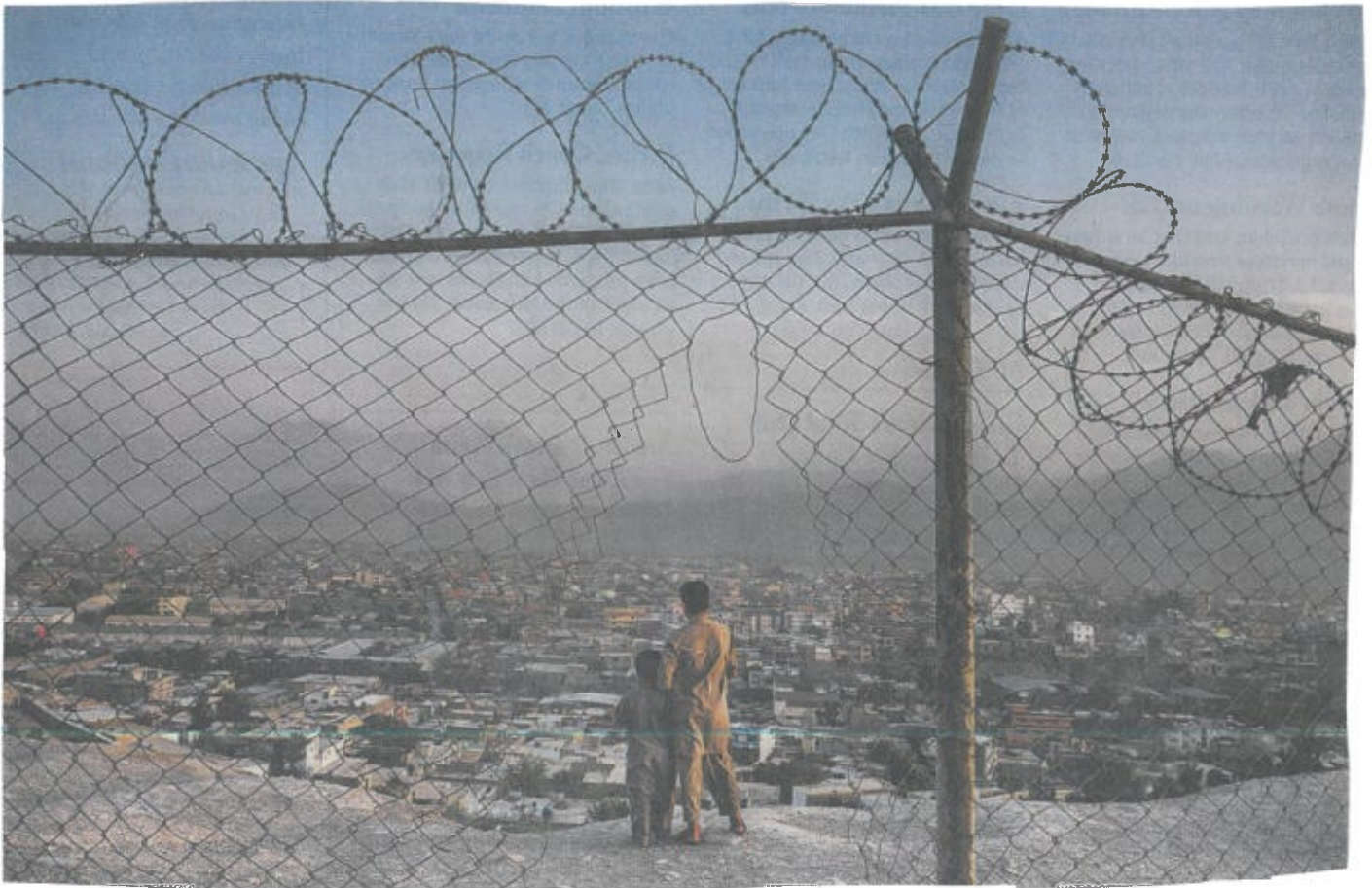

# The Women Behind Black Lives Matter

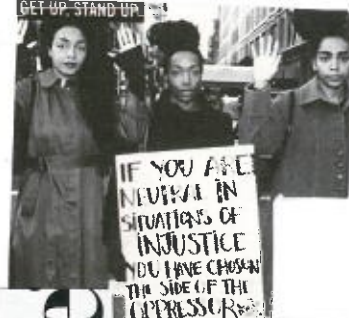

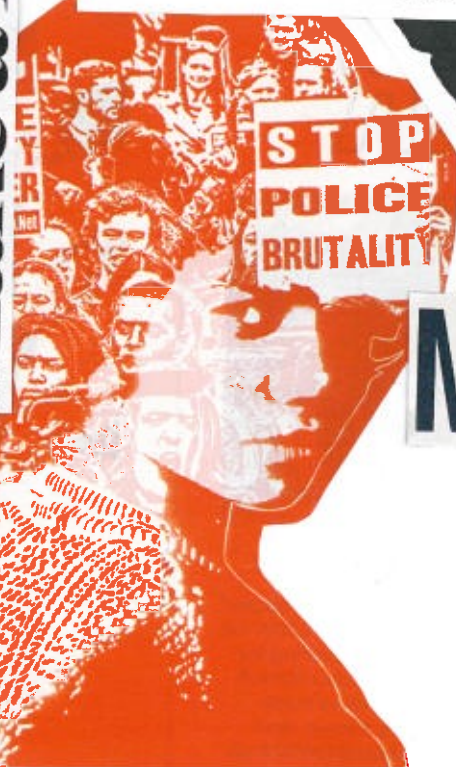

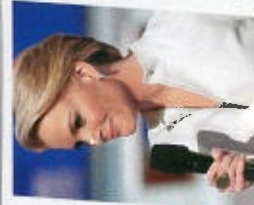
