



WHAT IS MINCO?

The Minority Coalition is a student-run organization created to be a unified voice against prejudice and discrimination that represents historically marginalized student populations relating but not limited to gender, religion, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity, and nationality. MinCo serves as a platform for collaboration between its steering board and members--subgroups, at-large and committee representatives.

GET INVOLVED

MinCo holds weekly General Committee meetings every Tuesday at 7 PM in Jenness House. Additionally, all subgroups usually have weekly general meetings. All are welcome. MinCo has a listserv through which information relating to MinCo and subgroup events, initiatives, and activities is distributed regularly. Each subgroup holds elections for MinCo reps in late spring. MinCo also holds elections for steering board positions in late spring. Further questions or concerns? WHO IS MINCO?

MinCo is comprised of subgroup organizations, currently including: the Asian American Students In Action (AASIA), Black Student Union (BSU), Chinese American Student Organization (CASO), International Club (IC), Koreans Of Williams (KOW), Muslim Student Association (MSA), Queer Student Union (QSU), South Asian Student Association (SASA), Students Of Caribbean Ancestry (SOCA), Vista, Williams African Students Organization (WASO), Williams College Jewish Association (WCJA), and the Women's Collective. Each subgroup provides a MinCo rep for weekly MinCo General Committee meetings, which include at-large and committee representatives in addition to the MinCo Board members.

MINCO'S MISSION

MinCo speaks as a collective voice representative of its minority subgroups. MinCo actively strives to promote and facilitate inter-subgroup collaboration and advocates for minority concerns throughout the wider campus at Williams. MinCo allocates funding and resources towards the development of educational and activist programming initiatives concerning minority issues.
